Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's sixteenth season we were able to field six junior teams: one each in the Under 16, 14, 13, 12, 11 and 10 age groups; three small sided teams: two under 8s and an under 9; four mini teams, two under 7s and two under 6s; two senior men's teams in the Raahauge Cup competition and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 16 teams. This is an increase on the number of junior teams fielded in 2013.

Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. We are very fortunate in being able to choose and the advantage of this can be seen in the under 13s who returned to NSWCFCA this season after a couple of years in GDSFA and the increased enjoyment this provided for the players, playing in an appropriately graded competition. These decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided. The decision of the NSWCFCA this season to grade the under 11 through 13 teams into two appropriately graded competitions appears to have been a good one and certainly catered well to our three teams involved.

We had two teams win their respective grand finals and I know many club people were able to share in the excitement of these two great matches. Thanks for your support. The All Age Men won the very prestigious Raahauge Cup 1st Division competition, in a very atmospheric grandfinal at Marconi Stadium. This win will see them progressing to Premier League next year and I know the boys are keen. The next week it was the Ladies turn, becoming our first GDSFA Grand Champions when they won their grand final in the Division 4 competition. The under 12s and 9s went close, both losing very close grand finals and the under 11s, 14s and Raahauge Cup Reserves all qualified for semis without being able to progress. In the knockout the under 11s and 12s were both champions, the 13s and B Grade Men were both runners up and at the six a side the 12s and All Age Ladies were champions. Our under 17 invitational team also took out the Kings Sevens tournament.

Zone representative matches for the younger players took place again in 2014 and we had numerous representatives – congratulations to Ali Fahme, Owen Thai, Fouad Ayoub, Dylan Lu, Samuel Kidane, Mustafa Fahme, Christian Frangie, Aaran Batth, Mounir Hadid, Shaleen Nagar, William Durbidge, Joel Carder, John Luke El Rahi, Christopher Abosh, Qais Sungkar and Andrew Ibraheem on their selection.

In 2014 the National Titles for 14s, 16s and 18s were hosted by NSWCFCA and McCredie was represented in the NSW City sides by Matthew Richards and Kabin Rana (14s), Willem Booker and Alan Trad (16s), William Wark (18s), Darren Warren (23s) and Mika Oo, Genell Hunt and Taufu Kivalu(AAL).

Congratulations to Mohamed Rahimi who this season secured a professional football contract in Malaysia. Mohamed was a McCredie junior and senior player and came back this season for a few games after the Malaysian season finished in July, but has since returned to Malaysia. We wish him all the best.

The club's executive was elected in November but unfortunately we were unable to fill all positions. The fundraising coordinator's role remained unfilled for the fourth year running and needs filling in 2015. I would like to thank all the committee, Peter, Dorothy, Carolynne, Darren, Ian, Ania, Peter, Phil and Robert for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club. I would like to specially mention Frank Skiller who retired from his committee position this year after many years loyal service. Frank still manned the barbie on six a side weekend which was most appreciated – it's nice seeing him around.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. Looking forward to catching up with you all again in 2015!

Under 6 Red Team Report



Under 6 Red had an amazing season! There was fantastic soccer, constant improvement, some extraordinary wins, and great displays of talent and effort.

At the start of the season, it was a new experience for many of the players. But right from the start, the talent of some of the players was clearly seen. And this was evidenced by some spectacular wins that carried through the whole season.

As the season progressed, the players did too. The style of play at the start of the season was very unstructured and haphazard. But over the season, the players developed in their understanding of the game on many levels: defending and attacking, and how they're different, passing, positioning, reading the flow of the game. About half way through the season, we particularly worked on having forwards, midfielders and backs, and how each position was different. It was hard for them at first and took a few weeks to sink in. But when they started to get it, it was so beautiful to watch them play a more structured and intelligent game! Their understanding of passing and teamwork also grew – they weren't tackling each other or getting in each other's way as much, and even passing to each other times! It was so exciting to see the kids learning and growing in their understanding and skills.

The skill and effort of the players individually was also a delight to watch! The talent of some of the players was very clear from the start, like Adhar's dribbling up to the goal to shoot, or Wek's strong kick, with either foot, and all round ability from defending to attacking. But equally exciting to watch was the development of the players, so that their personal styles and strengths started to shine more and more over the season.

Abbas Alkaabi only managed to join us once for the game, but it was great to have him, and he showed good energy and effort when he was there.

Adam Assan-Larry improved heaps over the season, in both defending and attacking. He also had some shining moments like scoring 4 goals one game (!) and proving to be one of our strongest and boldest goal keepers - throwing himself at the attackers, and saving heaps of goals.

Adhar Yaar was our strongest attacker and top goal scorer. It was amazing to watch him weave through the defence with his skilful dribble, and then shoot with such accuracy and consistency! But Adhar showed that he was there to learn too, and grew heaps in teamwork as well as showed good effort in other positions.

Ater Ajou was keen to get into the game, but started off quite unsure; until he scored his first goal! You should have seen his face light up! It was like a turbo engine was turned on - he grew heaps in enthusiasm and energy, and was keen to learn and get into the action anywhere he could.

Keeyan Ali was a great and solid team player, but soon into the season, he proved particularly strong in defence. He stopped attackers getting through, chased down loose balls, cleared balls to safety with a big, strong kick, and was a fierce goalkeeper whenever we needed one!

Rehab Shabir was never scared to get involved, and showed great effort at any position she tried. We only had the pleasure of Rehab joining us for a few games, but it was always great to have her and great to see her grow in her confidence and understanding of the game.

Patrick Matta receives the *Coach's Award* for enthusiasm, good improvement, all-round effort, and the most number of coach punishments during training! ☺ It was especially great to watch Patrick shine during his scoring streaks, or when playing roaming goal-keeper when we only had 4 players (which happened often!).

Talitha Chung was a great all-round player, and gave her best effort to as many different positions and skills as she could. Talitha was particularly strong in defence and at reading the game to make sure she was at the right place at the right time.

Wek Deng was our best all-round player. He had heaps of natural skill, a good ability with both feet, a strong kick, and skill in both defending and attacking. As the season progressed, Wek's goal-scoring also continued to increase. But Wek was also a humble and teachable player, working hard to listen, learn, and grow however he could. A perfect combination for a superstar in the making!

You were a joy to play with (and win with!) Under 6 Red, and we hope we can do it all again next year!
