Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's eighteenth season we were able to field eleven junior teams: one each in the Under 18, 16, 15, 14, 12, 11 and 10 age groups, two in the under 13 and 11 age groups; three small sided teams: two under 8s and an under 9; four mini teams, an under 7s and three under 6s; three senior men's teams in the Premier League competition and Challenge Cup and an All Age Ladies team — a total of 22 teams. This is an additional team on our 2015 numbers and the second most number of teams that we have ever fielded.

Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior mens' teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. Due to the inability of NSWCFA to have U13 or 14 competitions in 2016, we entered the most number of teams we have entered into GDSFA. Decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided. The decision by NSWCFA to grade the U10 and 11 competitions was well received and allowed our U11 Black team, most of whom were U9/10 to play U10s providing a better competition for all.

Disappointingly in 2016 we were only able to field 3 senior men's teams, and whilst the Premier League squad had a great season, the Challenge Cup side was less successful. The strength of our Premier League depends on the 3rd (and 4th) teams we can field so it is important we rebuild this squad in 2017. Moving the side out of Challenge Cup and into the easier Sydney Cup will be better for all the players but requires another side, which hopefully some of our graduating junior players will be able to provide. More disappointing though was the collapse of our U16 Girls team. Prior to the season starting we had 10 players, but by the time the comp started this had dissolved to 4 players. In the end the new Saturday morning girls' competition didn't happen as other clubs found similar difficulties, and with us withdrawing, the whole plan was disbanded. This was a bitter blow for our club and the Association trying to do something new. Happily the 4 girls that remained all played in U14, 15 and 16 mixed teams for McCredie and had good seasons.

We had some very successful teams in 2016 with The U10 Whites winning the competition. The U10 White, 11 Red and Premier League sides finishing as minor premiers. Unfortunately only the U10s proceeded to their grand final. The U10 Black, U13 Black and All Age Ladies were all runners up and the 13 Blacks played in their grand final. For the first time in the club's history the PL squad won the State Cup, winning through 3 rounds and a final. The six a side returned to the old days with McCredie having a very successful day winning the A Grade, U18, U14, U13, U10 and U6 competitions. The U14s also managed to win the prestigious Kings Sevens Title in July.

With the movement of Falcons to the North Zone, the Zone representative matches for the younger players were much closer in 2016 than 2015. South Zone featuring McCredie players Dut Atak, Talitha Chung, Joseph Douehi, Omar Elbizri, Lachlan Lin, Samuel Shamoun, Adhar Yaac, Malachi Daniels, Joshua Depares, Ali Fahme, Joey Farah, Sajjad Karimi, Sebastian Kerr, Emanual Koroma, Daniel Kvesic, Mustafa Elbizri, Ali Fatlawi, Samuel Kidane, Fraz Maqsoodi, Mohammed Matar, Khalif Reigal, Abuk Yaac, Matthew Youssef, Abdul Agha, Makuac Kuol, Christopher Germanos, Adam Depares, Fayez Kabout and Jye Salsinha won 3 of the 5 competitions.

In 2016 the National Titles for 14s, 16s, 18s, 16s Girls, 23s, AAL and AAM were hosted by NSWCFA and McCredie was represented in the NSW City sides by Ryan Booker, Andrew Ibraheem, Mahmoud Jalloh, Abdul Jalloh, Joe Azzi & Nedim Fazlic (U14), Jakob Kaihea & Ahmed Ekdawy (16s), Warren Spencer-Scarr (18s), Sulafa Ageeb & Sharlene Muru-Tucker (16s Girls), Mohamed Rahimi & Darren Warren (U23s), William Wark & Amarvir Batth (AAM), Genell Hunt & Jenna Nowlan (AAL) and Greg Wark (coach U18s) & Dorothy Warwick (manager AAL). Congratulations to all. The 18s, 23s and AAM went on to be crowned National Champions and the following McCredie players were named in their respective All Star teams – Andrew Ibraheem, Sharlene Muru-Tucker and William Wark.

The club's executive was elected in November and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter, Dorothy, Carolynne, Phil, Ian, Hendrika, Jennifer and Wil for the support and work they did during a year, when a few tough challenges required significant skills and negotiation. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. If everybody brings a friend we will double our team numbers! See you all in 2017.







Well done everyone!




Senior Men - Challenge Cup


