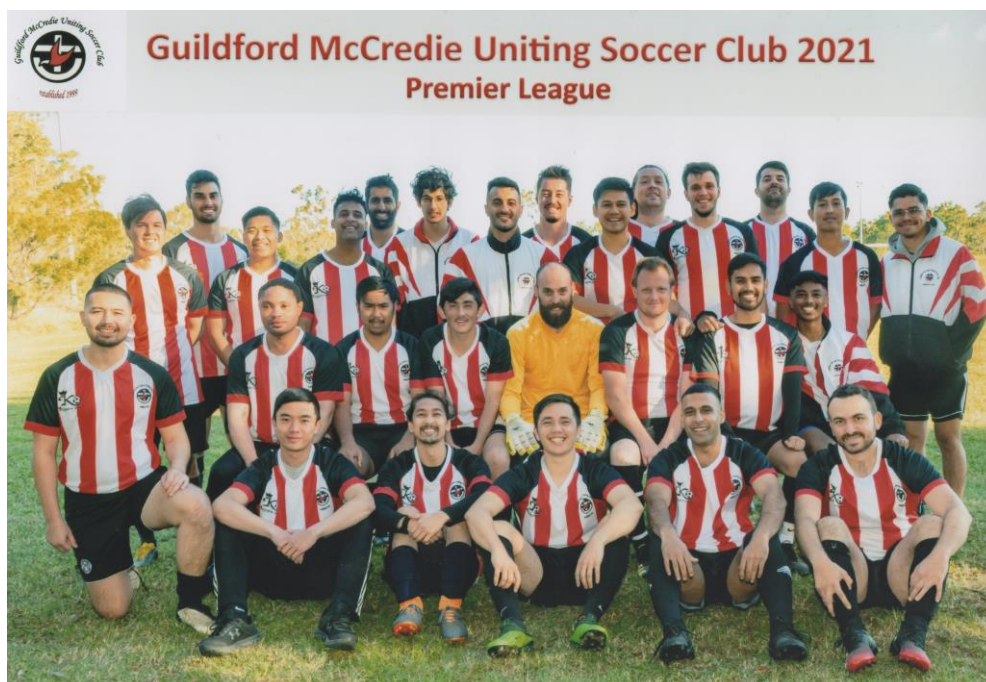

## Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's twenty-third season we were able to field twelve junior teams: three Under 11s; two each in the Under 12 and 18 age groups and one each in Under 13, 14, 14 Girls, 16 and 17 age groups; ten small sided teams: two under 8s, 9s, 10s and 12 Girls and an U8-10 Girls and an AAL on Wednesday nights; six mini teams, two under 6s and four under 7s; two senior men's teams in the Premier League and Premier Reserve competitions and an All Age Ladies on Sunday – a total of 31 teams. This does include one U12s team being a combination of players from all our U11 teams, playing an additional game each weekend and most of the Ladies (but not all) being the same across our Wednesday and Sunday competition teams. Regardless the growth of 9 teams for 2021 is outstanding and a testament to the hard work the coaches and managers put in for 2020. Congratulations all.

CFA Sydney worked hard to expand their Saturday girl's competitions again this season. There were more teams and clubs entered and the return of Ladies football to CFA after a break of 37 years was exciting. Unfortunately, most teams struggled for numbers early on forcing the return of 5 a side football to ensure that there were enough teams. This isn't a disaster, but it also isn't our preference.

With all that hard work it was very disappointing to have our season cut short by the Covid pandemic. Last year we started late but this year we finished early with just 10 of the 18 rounds played and no finals series. We were fortunate to have got our photos, six a side and lapathon in, but with all the work done and just the fun of the



downhill run into the semis left, it was very disappointing to finish so early. We do thank CFA Sydney and GDSFA for their preparedness to get things ready to play again but public health orders and lockdown extensions denied us the opportunity.

McCredie managed plenty of on field success before the cessation. With the return of six a side a number of teams had the opportunity to get mid season rewards. Our U6 Reds, U8 Reds, U8-10 Girls, U12 Girls, U14 Girls, U18 Black and AAL Red teams were all crowned Champions, leading to McCredie taking the Bill and Meryn Palmer Shield (Champion club) for the 4<sup>th</sup> straight event. In addition, our U6 Black, U7 Onyx, U11 Onyx, U12 Red, PR and PL were all runners up. At the time of the last game being played Premier League, All Age Ladies (Wednesday night), U11 Onyx and U8 White were all on top of the table and crowned minor premiers when play was unable to be resumed. Our Premier Reserves, U18 Black, U10 White, U9 White and U8 Red were all runners up. But despite looking odds on favourites to take the premier league crown for the first time in our history, we have been denied the opportunity by a pandemic. Such a shame for a bunch of guys who trialled in February and trained hard all season defeating last year's premiers and runners up convincingly.

The club's executive was elected in November, and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter W, Tahlia, Carolynne, Ian, Hendrika, Sarah, Elise, Mabel, Alex and Wil for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club. I would like to make special mention and give thanks again to Peter and Dorothy Warwick who work tirelessly in the canteen and Ian who ensures all 6 fields at Everley are always well marked. It was fantastic to see so many regularly helping Peter and Dorothy in the canteen too, people like Sue, Salma, Alun, Henry, Ola and Jen. Thank you all.

It is unclear at the time of writing whether we will be able to hold our Annual Presentation and it appears unlikely. We also now have the challenge to collect all the gear in including jerseys despite not being able to gather. If this equipment isn't returned, the financial damage to the club may be terminal. Please cooperate when you are contacted to return your jersey. The lockdown also occurred at a time when our canteen was fully stocked. Stock that would expire before our resumption in March was donated to a local food distribution service. I imagine that the recipients used to receiving bananas, bread and carrots would have been excited to also get some potato chips, Mars Bars and Powerade!

Following the incomplete 2021 season we will be offering a \$30 rebate to all returning senior players and a \$10 rebate for all returning junior players in 2022. Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. If everybody brings a friend, we will double our team numbers!

Thomas Tannous has been consistently improving all season and encouraging his team mates to improve as well. He has shown that through hard work you can achieve results and has had some great goals as well.

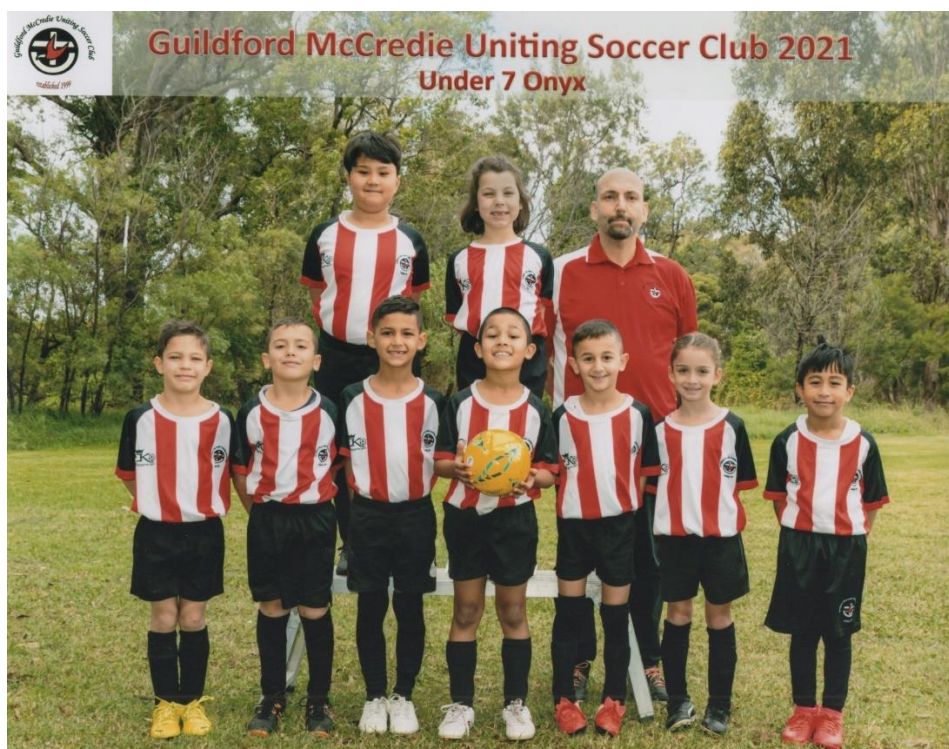
Shane is our little pocket rocket. Small in stature but Shane has proven that he is fast and skilled. Shane has improved this year in all aspects of soccer.

### **Under 8 Red Team Report**

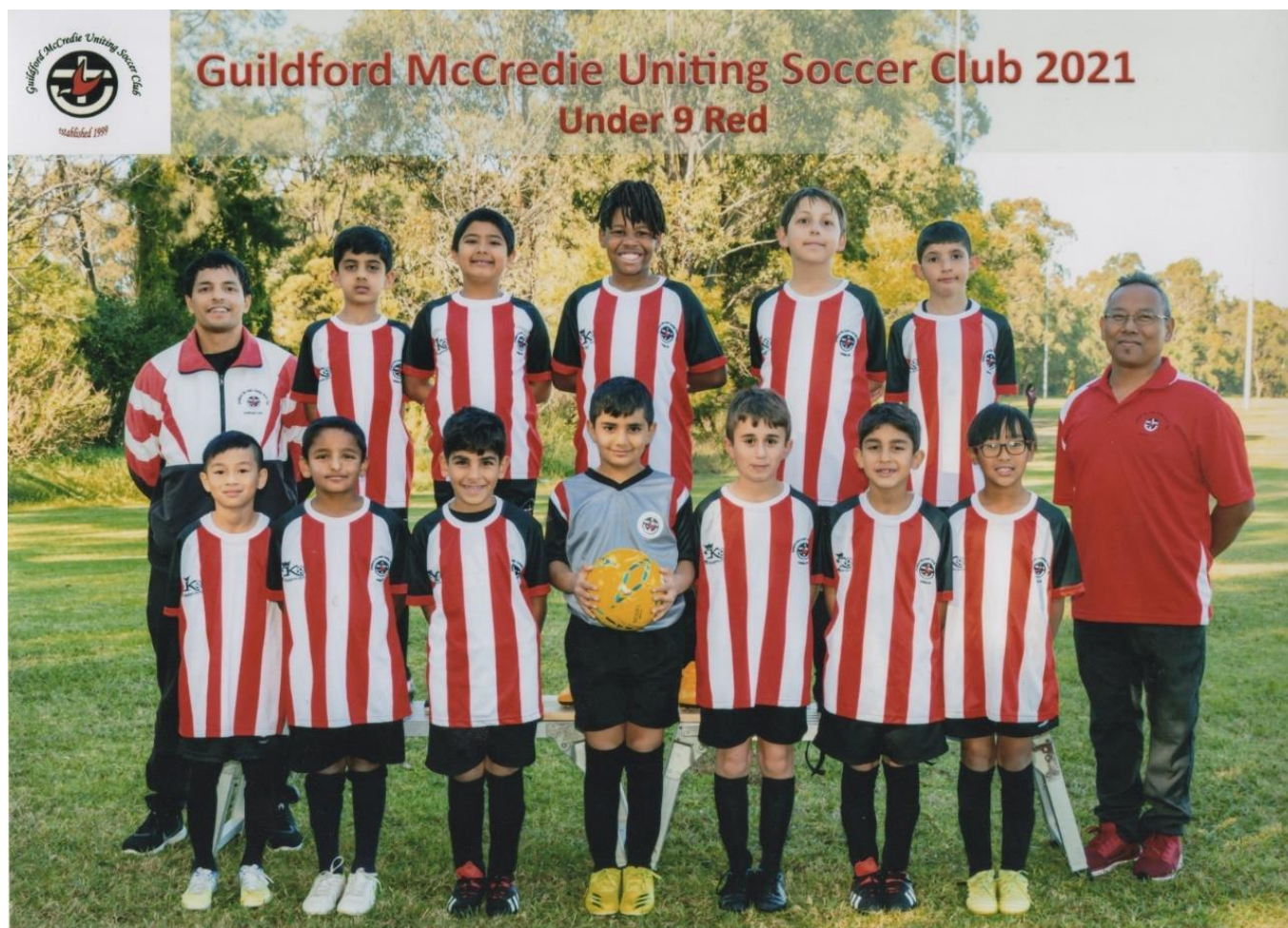

ALI: Smart player and fast in running and knows what he is doing, Ali scored a good goal by taking from the mid all by himself. Good in Forward and loves to run.

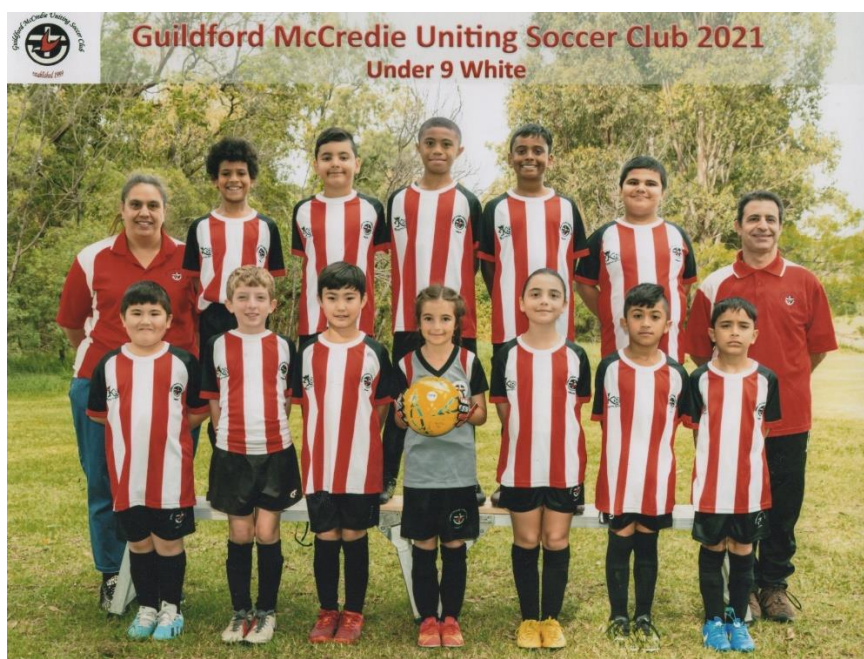
DANIEL: Quite but smart player, Daniel did really good defending, He was catching up with the ball skills and was very proactive after few games.

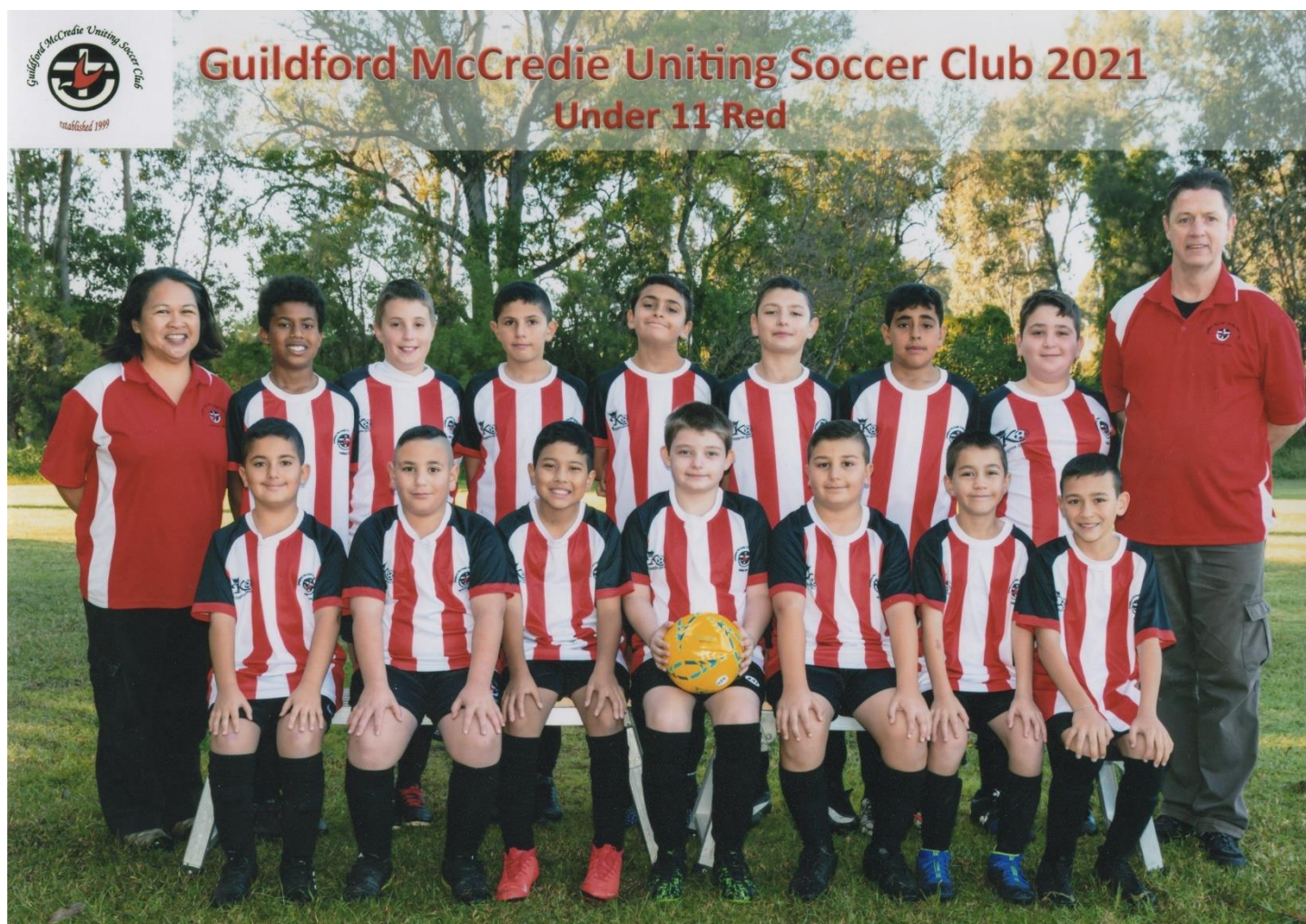

Abdallah Bin Abbas: Abdallah had a great understanding of soccer and was always willing to do what was best for the team.

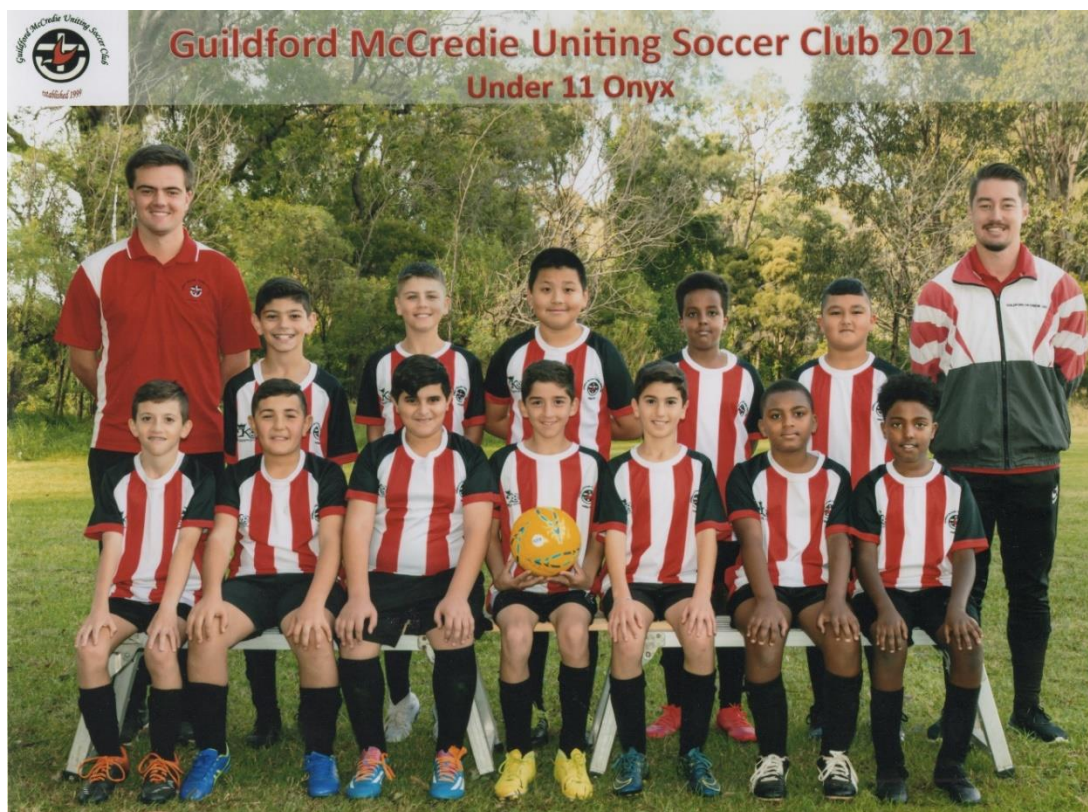

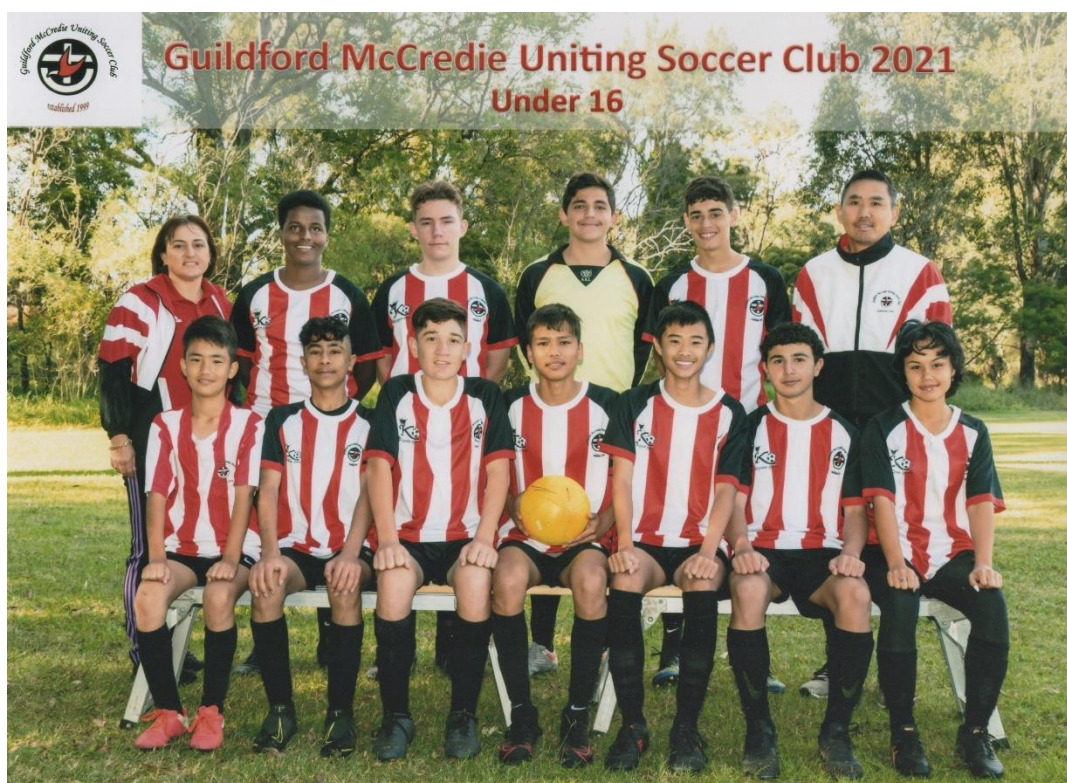
Theresa Hana, first year with the team, used in the midfield. Played well when on the field and showed improvement in each game. Only played three or four games before being injured

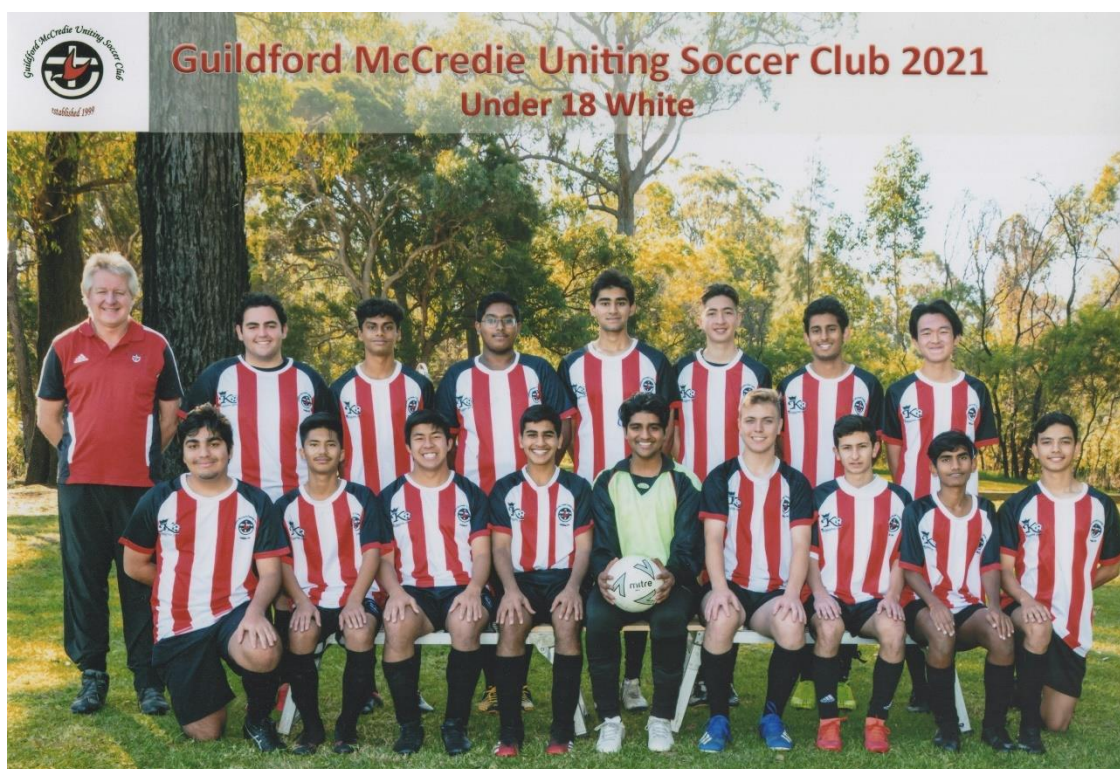

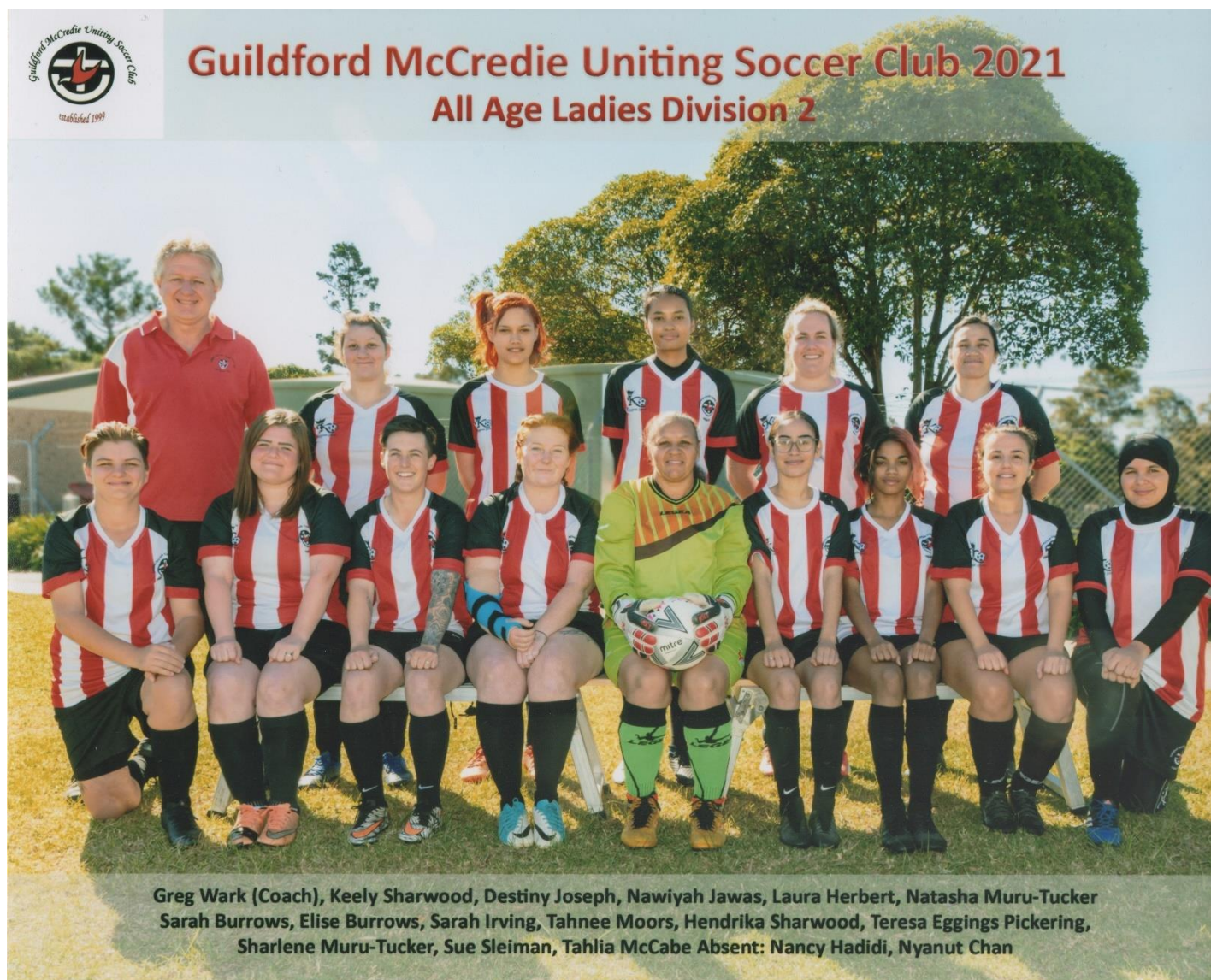

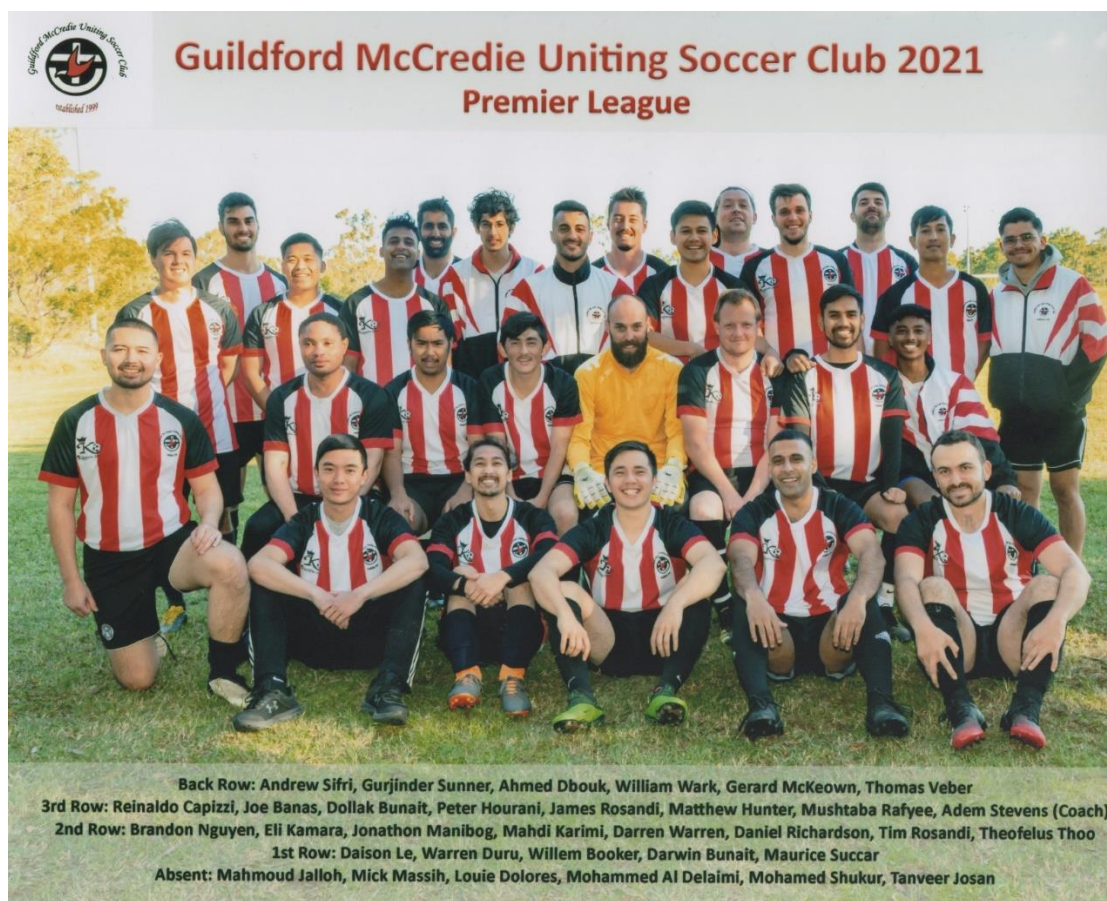
