NOTICE TO CLUBS

INJURED PLAYERS

If a player is thought to be <u>seriously injured</u> in the course of a game <u>under no circumstances is that player to be removed from</u> <u>the field</u>. Only a fully qualified medical person may remove such player and will be asked by the referee to sign as such.

Any unauthorised removal of any injured player may result in a void on an insurance claim.

The referee will advise the captain to call for an ambulance in these circumstances.

NOTICE TO CLUBS

SHINGUARDS / SHINPADS

- OFFICIAL POLICY -

The Association is committed to providing a **safe environment** in which affiliated Clubs can play and enjoy soccer. In particular, the Association requires players' equipment to be of a safe standard. The issue of appropriate standards for senior players' shinpads/shinguards is an emotive one that is raised each season. The purpose of this Notice being to clarify the **minimum acceptable** standards for this equipment.

Law 4 of the FIFA Laws of Soccer is quite specific in that shin guards must "**provide a reasonable degree of protection**". This Association's official policy deems a reasonable degree of protection is the covering approx. 80% of the shin area. A guideline for this on an average size senior player would be coverage from 2" (5cm) below the knee to 1.5" (4cm) above the ankle.

Most professionally supplied shinguards/shinpads marked "Senior" may therefore appear to suffice for Senior Players. Sizing can be difficult to estimate, but shin pads of less than 200 mm in size would not appear to give adequate protection for a Senior Player of average size and <u>will not</u> be accepted by the referees of this Association.

The Association Insurance Policy will not cover senior players whose shinpads/shinguards do not meet these size standards, and consequently no exemptions will be considered.

For junior and mini players, shinpads/shinguards must always be worn and must conform to the same coverage standards as senior players.

<u>NO PLAYER SHALL BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY GAME OF THIS ASSOCIATION UNLESS THEIR</u> <u>EQUIPMENT, SPECIFICALLY SHINPADS, COMPLIES WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME.</u>

Please ensure a copy of this **message is passed** to all senior players, Associate Referees and Coaches/Managers of Junior/Mini teams in your Club.
