Even a 5 year old can collect a corner post. Any parent can carry posts and learn to hang nets.

When you are required to set up a field you need to be at the ground earlier.

Nobody at McCredie is paid. It is your responsibility not "somebody else's".

Nobody should leave a field until it is dismantled if it is your team's responsibility.

Last Saturday, despite the newsletter reminders, a team left the field set up requiring the guy who has set the fields up and served in the canteen all morning the task of going out and taking down fields as well. Think about that. (By the way, it was not Peter who told me, he would never do that!)
