## Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's fourteenth season we were able to field four junior teams: one each in the Under 14, 12, 11 and 10 age groups; three small sided teams: two under 8 and an under 9; four mini teams, one in the under 7 and three in the under 6 age groups; two senior teams in the Raahauge Cup competition and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 14 teams. This is an increase on the number of teams fielded in 2011, with the loss of an under 13 team but growth in the mini teams, and a Ladies team being entered for the first time.

The committee made the strategic decisions to target our under 14s to ensure we did not lose the teenage teams as we did in 2011, increase advertising to ensure growth in the younger ages and work hard to create an All Age Ladies team. The success of the strategies employed is very pleasing and gives encouragement for future goal setting and our ability to implement these goals.

Each of these goals met bring with them their own thrill. The growth in under 6s is directly due to newspaper and school advertising which we intensified in 2012 and our history of providing well managed and coached sides giving parents confidence in our club's ability to organise things and provide a good product. It is now hoped that some parental support in club roles will follow. Clubs cannot be sustained on parents of players long since retired from playing, but rather flourish on the work of parents intimately involved with the club through their children. The 14s were potentially problematic with the loss of key players and a long term very popular coach. The fact the side continued, and then finished minor premiers is awesome and a huge thrill to the committee and the children who participated. Our entry into Ladies soccer was a carefully managed plan that involved entering sides in the Prospect Summer Comp and then charging very competitive fees. The committee support at matches, the commitment of the Ladies themselves right from the start, inviting friends and committing to training and games made for a very enjoyable season. They are already recruiting for 2013 which is fantastic!

Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. These decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided.

We again had some successful sides in 2012 and it was a pleasant return to some of the very successful years about 5 years ago. Our first success was in the newly revamped Knockout competitions. Traditionally these competitions were played on Saturday afternoons but falling interest had made them unviable. The change of format to make it an early season gala event breathed new life into the format, allowed even the 6s and 7s to participate and certainly seemed to suit our teams as we triumphed in the under 6 (6 Reds) defeating the 6 Whites in the final, under 9 and under 10 age groups. The seniors continued to play their knockout at night and the RCN squad was triumphant in the B Grade competition. In May at the Kings Sevens a combination of our 11s and 12s competed in the under 12 competition to qualify for the final undefeated and go down by the single goal to be runners up. The six a side competition was again popular and our 9s and 10s were triumphant.

In the competition proper the under 9 s and under 10s finished the season as Premiers – the under 10s undefeated. The under 14s also finished the regular season as minor premiers and the Under 8 Whites were runners up in B Division. The Raahauge Cup North Reserves won their grand final to finish Premiers. The under 11s and 14s both fell at the final hurdle, qualifying for the grand final but finishing runners up. The under 9s and 10s went on to claim the President's Cup in their respective age groups.

The reintroduction of zone representative matches for the younger players was also popular and McCredie was well represented in the Southern Zone teams which were winners in the under 8 and 9 age groups. Congratulations to the following players on their selection and participation: Under 8 Mustafa Fahme, Christian Frangie, Anthony Tannous and Aaran Batth; Under 9 Yunus Jamil, Ryan Booker, Yel Chan, Mounir Hadid and Shaleen Nagar; Under 10 Qais Sungkar, Joe Azzi, Yusuf Jamil, Jackson Hunt, Andrew Ibraheem, Joshua El Kerr, Safwan Hamdan and Nedim Fazlic.

In 2011 the NSWCFCA sent a Men's Team to the National CFA Titles and won. In 2012 in addition to senior men's, Under 14 and 18 teams were selected to travel to Queensland to compete. Congratulations to Adem Stevens who was selected in the NSWCFCA Men's team, William Wark and Mohammed Rahimi (U18s) and John Kazzi, Jason Tran, Willem Booker and Peter Youssef (Under 14s). Congratulations too to Tony Lo (Raahauge Cup squad 2012 and McCredie junior) who played in a pre season trial match for Sydney FC. Now you will have to pay to watch him!

The club's executive was elected in November but unfortunately we were unable to fill all positions. Phil Rafter did not stand in 2012 but remained very involved with the club. Tom List also left the committee and we thank him for his work over the last few years as Club Coach and Assistant Secretary. Tom's family moved away and it is a testament to the committee that despite all the work that Tom did and the gap he left, we were able to have such a successful year as a club, both results wise and in terms of the general good feeling and fun all around. The fundraising coordinator's role remain unfilled for the second year running and needs filling in 2013. We did welcome Darren McGuire onto the committee and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter, Dorothy, Carolynne, Darren, Ian, Frank and Robert for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Like the last couple of years McCredie will enter senior sides in the NSWCFCA Summer Comp.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. Thanks again for a terrific 2012 and I look forward to next year when hopefully we will continue to grow and have as much fun as we did in 2012 – so bring your friends!

## All Age Ladies Report



Well this really was a thrill. After watching Aluel playing around at Granville Park with her kids every Wednesday night in 2011 we, as a committee, made a decision to try to enter a Ladies team into competition in 2012. We started by calling for interest in entering 6 a side Ladies teams in the Summer Competition at Prospect and, with the help of a group of keen mums from McCredie and some Merrylands SFC players we entered 2 teams. The venture was a successful one not the least because of Tom List's commitment to the project as coach.

Hopes were high however, following registration, numbers remained low. Newspaper ads had got us a few and a sprinkling of mums from the summer comp and a senior player's sister meant we had almost enough to enter but not quite. It was my phone call to Laura (a new player we had attracted via the paper) to tell her we probably not get enough players that turned things around. Laura pleaded that we give it another week, so we did.

At training we attracted a couple more (including a passing jogger – who ended up being one of our most reliable – at every game and all, but one, training!) and with GDSFA support we entered the side. A few more friends joined, I raided the staffroom at Granville PS and picked up some more and after a couple of early dropouts and the very unfortunate injury of Laura in a trial match (Laura, who had made sure that the team had gone ahead, was unable to play a game due to that very unfortunate injury) we settled on our 16 team members.

The learning curve was steep with only two members of the team having played before, but for most players the enthusiasm was high, training took place weekly all season and was well attended and on only one occasion did we play a match with less than 11 players.

Our first point came away, against Lidcombe, in the rain. Our first win came at home, in the rain against Winston Hills Black. Our second win was away against Winston Hills White in the rain. It became clear that the ground didn't matter – but the weather did. We wanted more rain! And more Winston Hills teams! As the competition went on we found that we could win in the sun and play really well against even top sides. Auburn were one of the front runners and until 3 minutes from time we were 1-0 up. Unfortunately they scored a long range goal but it proved we were now competing. What was actually happening was that we were improving. Out of sight. Quickly. In fact more quickly than our oppositions. We beat both Winston



Hills teams again in the second round too. What is notable is that Winston Hills White would go on and contest the semis in the week after we defeated them and finish third. We had come a long way and things look very positive for 2013 with many of the team looking to bring friends and all our team (the youngest in the comp) with a year of learning behind them.

Sarah Irving (there are 4 Sarahs) was our goal keeper. I am biased but the other coaches who stated she was the best goal keeper in the comp were not. Ironically, the number 2 keeper in the comp may well have been Fatmeh but overseas travel and family illness restricted her involvement. Sarah Rebenko was not at all keen to play sweeper initially. However when I drew to her attention to the fact that every time she left that position or had a break, the other team scored two goals, she understood the importance of being a team player and played the position week in and week out (with occasional runs up the field as our defence strengthened). And didn't our defence strengthen. Sarah Huynh is the most unlikely of enforcers and she still has no idea of how good she is. Huynhy was the first to grasp the concept of marking and when we gave her a player to 'snuff out' she did an amazing job. Even the best of players found it very hard to slip Huynhy's marking. Katrina played on the left and Mo in the middle. Both developed their ability to clear and whilst both enjoyed giving the coach the odd heart palpitation, their development, Huynhy's marking and Sarah R's sweeping up, made sure our team had a firm defensive foundation to build on.

It took us a while to sort out the most effective midfield combination. By the end of the year Hendrika and Aluel owned the central midfield. By the halfway mark in the season Aluel had begun to show the skills she demonstrated in 2011 on a Wednesday night. Her ability to control a ball and deliver it to the forwards was her strength and I even saw a well executed 'stepover' in the final match! Hendrika takes no prisoners and as her knee mended and the coach worked out the best spot for her she was able to contribute enormously to some of our strongest performances at the back end of the season. Elise swung between the central and wide midfield positions, tackling everything that moved and never giving up. Elise was maybe the first player in the team to work out that if she ran, she would get there first! Wide on the left and right Ebonnee and Sarah Dubois improved their play throughout the season. Ebonnee ran more and more as the year went on and loved nothing more than to chase down an opposing player and tackle hard. Sarah's favourite moment had to be her goal from 20 metres against Pendle Hill – a great finish.

Ania and Emma played as very useful utility players. Emma always did her best to play the ball to one of our players and may have been the first player to start playing through balls in behind the defence. Ania was super reliable, a really positive influence on the team and absolute gold for a coach. Ania played both in the back and midfield, wide or in the middle, I don't remember her in goals but she played just about everywhere else and always with enthusiasm. Ania is allowed to be nice to our team and care for the injured (as she did often) but has been banned from chasing the ball for the other team so they can throw it in quickly! (I told you she was nice!)

From early on it was clear that if we were going to be successful Genell was going to need to score goals. Genell is quick, determined and has a good shot. Other teams also worked out that if we were going to be successful Genell etc So they tried to stop Genell. The other teams were not always successful but we did need something else. We knew Mika could run (after all we signed her up as she jogged around the park), but setting her up so that she received the ball behind the defensive line and then getting her to finish the chance required some time. As the season progressed Mika and Genell's combination grew and started to give the opposing teams more headaches. Both girls scored some great goals and in fact between them scored all but two of our goals.

So that was the year. Great fun, lots of learning and a real development of camaraderie amongst the team, despite their very different backgrounds. Thanks to Tom for setting it up, the experienced McCredie mums for providing the firm foundation, the generous number of supporters who travelled with us (including the number of committee people who came along) and to Wil for his help on game day as manager. Things look very good for 2013.
