## Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's twenty-fifth season we were able to field twelve junior teams: two Under 11s, two Under 12s, four Under 13s and one each in Under 14, 14 Girls, 15 and 16 age groups; ten small sided teams: two under 8s, two 9s and two 10s and an U10 Girls & an 12 Girls and an AAL and Over 35 mens on Wednesday nights; two mini teams, an under 6s and an under 7s and four senior men's teams in the Raahauge Cup & Raahauge Cup Reserves and Premier League & Premier Reserve competitions: a total of 28 teams. This does include one U13s team being a combination of players from all our U13 teams, playing an additional game each weekend. The fact that we have been able to retain our strong team numbers after three very disrupted Covid affected and rain affected seasons is a testament to the work of our volunteers.

What a joy to have an uninterrupted, 'normal' season. No covid interruptions and the only washout was a single all age match, played the following Thursday night. Bliss!

Six a side always sees a number of teams have the opportunity to get mid season rewards. Our PL men defended the Reuben Henry Shield; and the Ladies the Geoff Baker Shield again (every year since 2018) with our second team being runners up; the U14s won the Peter Bywater Shield; the 10 Greys won the Joan & Roy Pearson Shield and the 9 Reds won the Ken James Shield and the U16s, U13 Onyx, U7s and 6s were runners up. As a club we won the Bill & Meryn Palmer Shield (Champion Club) for the 6<sup>th</sup> year running and 10<sup>th</sup> time overall. A great day.

In the State Cup our Premier League men sought and won revenge on Kings Old Boys, reclaiming the Cup.

In weekend competition we won eight minor premierships – U8 White, U10 Girls, U12 Red, U13 Onyx, All Age Ladies, Raahauge Cup Firsts, Premier Reserves and Premier League. Seven of these teams (U8 White, U10 Girls, U12 Red, U13 Onyx, All Age Ladies, Raahauge Cup Firsts and Premier League) went on to complete premiership victories – absolutely amazing! The U13, AAL (3 years undefeated) and Premier League defended their titles from 2022.

The club's executive was elected in November, and I would like to thank the committee who work so hard to keep the club running, Peter W, Carolynne, Ian, Sarah, Elise, Mabel, Alex and Wil Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

I would also like to thank Councillor Ola Hamid, for the support she always provides our club, whether managing the 10 Reds, helping in the canteen or local improvements like the awesome lights at Granville Park. Fantastic! All of the parents who help out in the canteen are much appreciated but without Dorothy and Peter, ordering, setting up, cooking, serving and packing up - this is what service looks like, and we greatly appreciate it.

In 2023 the CFA was able to expand through advertising with a brand new club and enough growth in other clubs to create SSG (rather than mini) girls comps, extra junior divisions and an U13 competition. The plans are for further growth to include both U14s and U17s in 2024 as well as an additional junior girls comp and growth in senior and Ladies numbers. It is exciting! At McCredie we will continue to be innovative and provide suitable competitions for all our members. The U14 development program will continue and in 2024 we are planning for the first time in McCredie's history - a second Premier League Squad. Get on board!

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. In 2024 ALL fees will be paid up front or the registration will not be accepted. Remember if everybody brings a friend, we will double our team numbers, but we also need twice as many volunteers. Nobody is paid, so please think how you can support your children in their participation in sport.

## Under 8 White Team Report



Congratulations team! A wonderful season with the team taking the 2023 minor premierships and premiership.

Thankfully, a completely different season in terms of weather from 2022 which meant we missed no matches. It was fantastic to have Peter Leke join the coaching staff as assistant coach and covered for the times Karim was away. Both Karim and I are deeply grateful for Peter's assistance and his coaching style brought something new to the team. Karim's encouragement of the team and no-nonsense approach worked well for the team and helped maintain discipline throughout the year.

The pre-season turned out to be a good indicator of what our season was going to look like, with wins in both our trial matches against St Patrick Blacktown and Lidcombe Churches including a big 8-0 win against St Patrick and a 5-0 win against Lidcombe Churches. Our season started with what would turn out to be the biggest win of a season, defeating Greystanes FC Blue 9-1 with our striker Irfan scoring all nine goals.

Our second match saw our biggest loss, 3-2 against Inter Parramatta. However, the coaches and manager were proud of the team who showed grit in the match with only 7 players available against IPFC's 9 players and 2 subs. Only an infringement that was called against IPFC when Irfan had his ankle clipped while starting a breakaway run stopped us from drawing the match. We would go on to lose our only other match of the season to IPFC again, late in the season. We ended with 3 draws against Greystanes FC White, IPFC and OLQP.

The rest of the season saw the team add win to win with team regularly scoring 4-5 goals per match.

Irfan continues to be our standout striker scoring the overwhelming majority of our goals with a big contribution by Neal P, Jacob, Jess, George and Thomas ensured our goal tally at the end of the season stood at 64 goals. Our defence stood strong too conceding 18-goals to make us the second strongest defence in the division and giving us a goal difference of 46-goals, by far the best in the division with second placed Greystanes FC White having the next best goal difference of 24.

Our team also made a strong contribution to the Yellow Rep team this year with Irfan, Thomas, Jacob and George making it into the team. Unfortunately, the Yellow Rep team struggled against a very strong Blue Rep team and lost both matches by a considerable margin. However, in a bright spot for the GMU boys, Irfan scored the only two goals for the Yellow team to get them on the scoreboard in both matches and Thomas was selected as captain.

Our last match of the season resulted in a big win against Greystanes FC White and saw us play them again in the first semi-final with Irfan scoring the only goal to take us directly to the grand final. The lead-up to the grand final was an anxious wait for all, as waited to see who our opponent from the GFC White vs IPFC preliminary final. The win by GFC White would mean we would not have to face the only team to have beaten us (twice) this season.

Grand Final day was magnificent for the team. One goal by Irfan, who scored with little space and defenders on all sides. Wonderful defending by Milan, Jess, Pablo, Zayden and Neil S including strong goalkeeping by Zayden and George meant that we took home the premiership. However, it was a team effort and each player played their part. The match was end-to-end and it could have gone either way.

Irfan Hussain: Our star striker who consistently tore up opposition defence with his dribbling, menaced teams with his free kicks from outside the box and corners and won matches for us. Some work to do in terms of more challenges for the ball and positioning but otherwise hard to fault. A star in the making. It's hard to forget the grand final when Irfan took a free kick from just outside the box and the entire Greystanes FC team took positions on the goal line to stop him, having been on the receiving end of his freekicks during the season. Irfan was a rep team member and scored two goals for the Yellow Rep team.

Thomas Cheung: A very fast, versatile player having played goalkeeper, forward and midfield. Thomas started off as a dependable goalkeeper but proved to be an effective attacking weapon due to his speed. Some work to do with challenging for the ball when defending but otherwise a great effort over the course of the season. A memorable goal against Greystanes United when Irfan took possession from inside our penalty box off a United corner, passed to Thomas and Thomas ran the length of the field to go one on one with the United goalie and score. Thomas was the Yellow Rep Team captain.

Jess Leke: Our team secret weapon who scares opponents with her dribbling and attack despite spending the entire season as a centre-back. We received many comments from opposition coaches and parents about Jess' talent and skill. The only area of development was the timing of passes to the forwards. A memorable moment, besides Jess' goal earlier in the season and her weekly efforts, was when an opposition coach, with a hint of relief in his voice, told his team they might be able to score when Jess was moved from centre-back to goalkeeper. Jess was the anchor for our defensive line and had no problem initiating counterattacks, dribbling past halfway to feed the ball to our forwards.

Zayden Benhatta: Zayden was wonderful in defence and attack. Unafraid to take on opposition players in tackles and also difficult to stop once he started running, Zayden also covered goals and performed memorably in the six-a-side as a goalkeeper stopping multiple shots from in front. Zayden performed admirably in goals in the last few weeks of the season, coming out on top in a few one on one encounters with opposition strikers. Could work on positioning at times, but positioning is an ongoing matter for a good number of our team. A highly versatile player.

Milan Bhattari: Milan emerged as a strong defender since last year and has only gone from strength to strength. Technically proficient as a defender, it is difficult to fault any part of Milan's game. Despite his small stature, he displayed courage week after week challenging opposition attackers whenever they came down his wing. Completely dependable in defence, respectful towards coaches and listened to instruction throughout the season. Thank you, Milan.

Jacob Ibrahim: The team fitness machine. Jacob could be found everywhere on the field, was never tired and never needed to be subbed off. Jacob was a highly dependable player in our midfield and was always in the thick of the action, ready to take possession of the ball. The only area of development is challenging for the ball and tackling. Having said that, Jacob stepped up in the grand final and tackled like we had never seen before. Jacob scored his share of goals and is an asset to the team. Jacob came first in the team for Lapathon having completed 21 laps. Also a goalscorer in the six-a-side comp and rep team member.

Neal Pradhananga: Neil is a highly competent player, brave and skilled with dribbling and tackling. Unafraid of challenging for the ball, Neil could get past defensive lines easily when he pressed forward and was the second highest goalscorer for the team. A strong shot complements Neil's skill and talent. Some development needed on match fitness and following-up initial unsuccessful challenges or intercepted passes but otherwise a good all-round player with leadership potential.

Neil Shreshta: A quiet and unassuming player, Neil was respectful, listened well and demonstrated skill early on. Neil has brought a lot of enthusiasm to the team, strong running and persistence in chasing down opposition attackers. Neil played primarily in the midfield and was versatile in defence and attack. Neil played memorably in goals during our semi-final, saving a shot on goal from short-range and making multiple other saves. The only area of development,

similar to many of the team, was that of challenging for the ball and committing to tackles. Otherwise, a dependable and versatile player who is an valued asset to the team.

**George Alqass:** George has proven to be the team standard when it comes to challenging and tackling. Brave and skilled, George had no problem getting into the opposition’s space. George improved dramatically with his dribbling over the course of the season and demonstrated skill with turns and keeping the opposition away when he had possession of the ball. The key area of development for George was listening to coach’s instructions and match fitness. A valued asset for the team who also played in goals multiple times including the semi-final and grand final. The most memorable moment this season was a save during the semi-final when the opposition striker took a shot from in front which George saved. Also, a goalscorer in the six-a side comp and played well in the Yellow Rep Team.

**Pablo Jiminez:** Pablo joined us a few weeks into the season having previously played with the U10s. Pablo has shown himself to be a good defender with a big kick to clear balls from our half. His efforts have stopped opposition attacking plays multiple times and let the team reset our attack. We went into this season with a plan to build upon the beautiful football the boys played the prior season and had gotten them into the finals. The Guildford McCredie White roster for 2023 consisted of 15 players, 12 of them returning from last year, so things seemed to be going according to plan.

Then our goalkeeper for the last four seasons drops out the day before our first trial game and another breaks his wrist during the warm-up, ruling him out for the rest of the year. We're down to 13 players and the dynamic of the team is altered before the whistle is even blown!

Positions are shifted, the new players integrated, a different playing system is adopted, it took the team the better part of the season to re-establish themselves. Throughout all this, another player breaks his wrist in a cycling accident and another his finger when a car door is slammed on it, so a great bulk of our games are played with no substitutes.

The boys had it tough, but like the previous season, they came good at the tail-end of the season. The football may not have been as beautiful, but it was dominant, and while the last game of the season did not go our way (again), the team finished it as much better players than when they started and that's all anyone can ask.

### Player Reports

**Akshan:** Player of the year! He's always been one of our best players, but two observations tipped the scales in his favour. One, the team lacked cohesion when he didn't play. They couldn't play as well or gel without him. He's the nucleus, the driving force of the team. Two, his defensive efforts were absolutely stellar. He's been a timid tackler in previous seasons, this year, he strongly challenged everything. Akshan really upped his skillset this year and that's why he has earned player of the year.

**George Massoud:** Coach's award. George turned into quite a leader this season. He was put in charge of defence and he directed the team with authority. Something else that impressed me was his confidence and control he exuded in the back line; the ferocity he displayed keeping out the opposition. He's come a long way since the under 9s and is well deserving of the award.

**Lucas Fisher:** Lucas was a close contender for the coach's award. He found his calling in the middle of the season, stepping up to become the team's goalkeeper and boy did he impress! He just got better and better with every game. Some of the saves he performed were nothing short of miraculous and like George, he began directing the team from the rear, telling them which defensive holes to plug, which players to mark etc. For someone who had to learn a new position, Lucas has had an incredible year and should be proud of his efforts.

Isaac: First year on the team and ever to play park soccer. The kid is bursting with talent; his technical skills need work, but his vision and positioning are exceptional. We tried him in various positions throughout the season, but right-back ended up his home (for now 😊). What also stood out for him was his decision-making; he knew the right call to make at any given time, passing the ball vs clearing the ball, rushing out to tackle a player vs pressing a player etc. Isaac has a fine-tuned football mind. If or when he ups his technical skills, he will become a force to be reckoned with.

Krish: A returning player who haven't played since the under 8s! It was good to have him back as we had regarded him as a solid player back then and nothing had changed since then (well, other than his height 😊). He had an extremely solid year partnered with George as a central defender. Of note was his cool and calm demeanour, his brilliant ball control and clearances under heavy pressure. He exudes a maturity beyond his years and was a pleasure to train this year.

Ahmed: I don't think any player furthered his development more than Ahmed, this year. His kicking game, for one, showed remarkable improvement from past seasons. He was pretty adept up front, but it wasn't until he was put at left back in the final third of the season where he really shined. Like the others making up the backline, he proved to be a super tough defender, the opposition didn't know what to make of him and he provided some sublime through-balls leading to crucial wins. McCredie White kept a clean sheet the last four games of the season and a lot of it had to do with Ahmed.

Youseff Ibrahim: Youseff initially had a stint up front, scoring a few goals and he is an impressive dribbler, but he ended up excelling as a defender. It wasn't just his positioning and clearances that stood out, he was also developing a decent passing game, hitting his stride, before a bicycling accident ended his season. I hope he returns and continues where he left off because he was going places.

Danyel T.: Danyel is the hardest working player on the team, but his development was hampered by a hand injury which saw him miss out a large chunk of the season.

Jacob: Jacob shifted from defender to midfielder this year. In his new position, he adopted a new style of play, focusing on smart, controlled, football, passing the ball rather than aimlessly kicking it, linking up with his teammates, transitioning from defence to attack. There are a few wrinkles in his game that need to be ironed out, like positioning and when to pass and when to dribble, but he is progressing in the right direction which is that of a talented playmaker.

Jonah: For Jonah, it was all about refining his game. He was challenged to learn some new skills this year, box-to-box running, controlling a high ball, pressing players etc. It was tough for him, but his determination to be a better player saw him through. Jonah became a more complete player by the end of the season and really impressed in the tail-end of the season. Not only did he keep the opposition at bay with stalwart defending, he bamboozled them with his attacking prowess. I hope he keeps this up for next season.

Julian: Julian had a tough year, but not in terms of quality. He spent the year targeted by the opposition, his movements restricted, limiting his opportunity to create chances and score goals, but that didn't deter him. For Julian, it was just a new obstacle to overcome. With some tactical re-engineering, he still finished the season as top scorer and provided assists to some crucial games. His technical skills are superb. He needs to focus on scanning and decision making for next season.

Daniel D: Strong year. He was shifted to the wing from midfield. He was getting tired quickly early in the games. This was due to Daniel's playing harder, not smarter mentality. He learned to flip his thinking as the year wore on; to play smarter, not harder, and turn himself into an effective attacking machine.

Youseff: New player. Loves the game, mean kick, but need to learn the nuances of the game; be at the right place at the right time, when to hold the ball and when to pass, how to shield etc. He did well in his first year, scored some important goals.
